
Uiver Creativity

Visits to the Uiver restoration project provided members with photography challenges such as lighting conditions and composition of shapes. The results of the Uiver photography competition were presented last month by Russ Jacob. A good diversity of member's interpretation were seen, including these successful images.

David Willis revealed how he achieved the blur effect to the image below. To create an impact with the subject, David removed the distracting background by selecting the engine and copying it to a new layer in Photoshop. A 'Zoom Blur' was then applied to the bottom layer. He made it all sound so simple!

"Composition in Landscape Photography"

by Internationally-acclaimed landscape photographer Mieke Boynton.

In 2008 Mieke travelled to the rugged and remote Kimberley region of Western Australia and promptly fell in love with the landscape. She took up photography as a means to share her amazement with family and friends, and quickly caught the photography "bug." She is now a full-time professional photographer living in her hometown of Bright, specialising in landscape and aerial photography, and she has won numerous International awards including the prestigious Epson International Pano Awards. She is a member of the Australian Institute of Professional Photography, and was named the AIPP Victorian Landscape Photographer of the Year in 2019. She regularly exhibits her work and thoroughly enjoys teaching photography through online workshops and individual tutorial sessions.

Her presentation begins with a very brief explanation of her background, and then – through audience interaction – highlights some helpful guidelines and common problems with Composition – particularly in regards to Landscape Photography. Annual Photo Competition

2021

Schnelle Partners Accountancy Practice is running their fourth annual photo competition and exhibition.

The Theme will be "Recovery". This is about the recovery from anything such as the environment and the locals after the fires, the recovery from isolation or an illness or it can be about the process of recovery.

The Exhibition will be open to the general public from the 5th July for at least two weeks and will then continue for the next 12 months if the photographer chooses. There is limited space for about 18 to 20 photos so the competition is limited to Wodonga Albury Camera Club financial members only. All photos will be available for sale to the general public or clients of the business.

DETAILS

- Theme: "Recovery"
- Entry: Free
- Prize: \$400 for the acquisition of the winning photo which will be displayed in the office.
- Judges: staff (all non-photographers)
- Photo size: At least 46cm on the longest edge but preferably bigger
- Frame: Black or White (preferably black and not obviously second hand)
- Matt: A must, or at least border >4cm, but whatever colour suites the photo
- Selection of Photos: Members need to send a maximum of 4 "WACC competition" sized digital files with WACC member number, photo title and email address to yvonnewaters@ozemail.com.au before 1st June.
- I will acknowledge all sent emails. 1 photo per member will be selected, subject to suitability, unless there are not enough entries. Entrants will be notified by the 14th of June which photo has been selected. This will leave 2 weeks for framing if not already in a frame.
- Sales: There will be no commission but, all sales will need to be made through the photographer.
- Enquiries: All enquires are to be made to Yvonne Schnelle on 0438 241 904. Please do not ring the office.

Arrangement for hanging will be made via email after the 2nd of June. There is a possibility that if we have enough suitable photos that they may be able to be hung and for sale at the Albury Club from 14th to 27th June.

WACC 2021 members survey

A summary of results

- **1.** There were 36 respondents. However, not everyone answered all the questions, or they had 2 or more options.
- **2.**The majority of respondents were in the "Advanced" group. 21 as opposed to 15 in the "Photography" group. Unfortunately, the survey really did not shed as much light as we would have liked on why there have been so few "Photography" entries over the last few months. We are still open for opinions.
- **3& 4** All respondents have access to computers. 5 said they would like assistance with resizing and submitting. We are going to commit to helping these members, but we are also happy to help others that may not be as confident as they would like. As you may be aware we are looking to move to using Visual Pursuits for the club. Hopefully once we have helped members set up and shown them how to use VP, submitting will no longer be an issue. I would like to add that VP is about future proofing the club. David, Neville and Brian all, especially David put many hours into making our presentation as good as VP. Without them, it would not be anywhere as good. However, they all would like to hand over the reins to someone or in this case VP.
- **5 & 6** A number of members mentioned they would like to learn additional editing/processing skills. There are already options for Photoshop training. David Willis and Easy Way Photography. PS is quite daunting, especially at first. WE would like to explore other options that give you a good amount of editing tools, but are easy to use. Once we have got submitting sorted out, we may be able to do some basic editing techniques/lessons.
- **7** Whilst there were only a few members who pre Covid did not submit many entries, about half of the members did not contribute much in 2020. Only 3 suggested that it was because we removed the print option. However, more than those mentioned about prints. Once again, I would like to look at options for this issue later in the year.
- **8** Zoom I think that is more for people like Wooly or the Victorians that got locked out of meetings in other clubs.
- **9** Half of the club were happy with any presentation from photographers. A slide was shown at the last meeting of what the majority of the remainders wanted. As you will be at least partly aware from the newsletter I have arranged for Mieke Boyton to do a presentation on "Composition in Landscape Photography" next month and David Skinner is giving a workshop on Judging the following month.
- **10** The majority of members said they would be happy to help with presentations. I have the list of helpers and their interests for anyone do a workshop or presentation. I have tried a couple of presenters on Black and White but no takers yet. If anyone has any ideas on who or maybe themselves could give a presentation on B&W, or in fact any other presentation or workshop please let me (Yvonne) know.
- 11. It was good to see that weekends or another Monday can be used for workshops and presentations.
- **12.** Interestingly the votes for the workshops were different from the presentations. We will try and work through all the options that showed a relatively significant interest. I may tap on a few shoulders for members to do 10-15 minute talks about things they are particularly interested in. If anyone has an idea. I (Yvonne) will be happy to discuss about making a time.

13 & 14. The mentor program

- **15** I would like to create a way that if someone wants to go somewhere taking photos they can communicate this to others that may be interested in joining them.
- **16.** Vicki has and will include in the Optic Nerve any exhibitions or outings that are coming up. If you find anything of interest please let her know.

- 17 Most respondents were interested in weekends away, a few have said they are willing to organise them. There is something out of the usual meeting in quite a few of the months. July, September, October and November a free if anyone would like to organise a weekend away. The fact that something may have been organised doesn't mean something else can't be. Yvonne has got the beginnings of a club calendar and would like someone to help her to reformat it in a way that it can then be printable in the Optic Nerve.
- **18** Cameras at least half of the respondents said that would like some assistance with their cameras. Most of the other respondents said that they were happy to help others. We will organise that once we have decided how.
- 22 Yvonne found from the responses that there needs to be less information about some things at Camera Club, especially as the information is already in the Optic Nerve. This way everyone can be aware of what is going on and coming up. If you are looking for any form of IT assistance, it is important that you ask a friend or arrange with a committee member to get someone to show you how it is done on your device.




We are also going to do more workshops that will encourage discussion and interaction with other members. David Skinner is doing one on judging at the June meeting.


There were also some very interesting ideas for presentations or competitions that some members suggested. We will explore these a little later on.


































Q10 - Are you prepared to help with club presentations? Yes 20
