Treasured Images of Travel

A wonderful aspect of photography is not just the enjoyment we get of being in the moment, but also the pleasure of being able to relive the memory when we look back over our images. This is an aspect that member Malcolm Godde highlighted when he described his trip to Africa. Here he outlines some of the background to the arrival at this wonderful scene he captured below of the Zebras in Kenya.

Back in 2012 I decided I would like to see the African wildlife up close & personal. After looking at all possibilities and considering safety, I chose Kenya. In July 2013 I flew to Nairobi in Kenya and hired a 4WD and a guide. I travelled to Lake Nakura National Park and spent three days there. From there I travelled to Amboseli National Park and stayed at Oltukai Lodge. It was then on to Samburu National Park for five days and then to the Masai Mara for six days. I saw an amazing array of wildlife and animals hunting their prey, and was lucky enough to see the Wildebeest crossing the rivers with all the Alligators waiting for them.

All the lodges I stayed at were extremely clean with fantastic meals and great staff. This zebra image was taken at Amboseli National Park late one afternoon. We could see the dust in the distance and the guide suggested we wait to see what appears from the dust. My camera was and still is a Nikon D3 and the lens was a 200-400 f 4 Nikon. 95% of all photos were taken on a bean bag out the window of the 4WD, as it was not smart to get out of the vehicle with all the animals around you. I took 3 lenses: 24-70 f 2.8, 70-200 f 2.8 & the 200-400 f 4. It was an amazing trip and I have a great array of pictures to reminisce about.

Peter Merritt - Wildlife Photographer

On Monday 28th February we were treated to a presentation by Peter Merritt. Peter has photographed wildlife, mostly birds from all over the world. He also captures many images whilst working on stations in Australia's outback. Despite the images not being in the order that he intended, he adapted very quickly and covered the places that he works and the water holes, dams and troughs where he likes to set up and wait for birds to come in to drink.

He demonstrated what makes a good photographic set up and provided many examples of good and not so good situations. He places great emphasis on achieving good backgrounds while photographing from his vehicle so that birds are not put off by human movement.

Peter then went on to show images of animals and birds taken in a wide variety of habitats using his particular approach. There were many memorable images of birds in flight, adult pairs of rare and uncommon species and unique views of many other species in natural settings. He described the gear that he uses and how he is set up ready to photograph as soon as an opportunity arises.

Everyone sat in awe and marveled at what Peter has achieved with his photography and the discussion has encouraged us to do better, wherever we may be. Thank you very much Peter for an inspirational presentation.
