Competitions Secretary's Words of Wisdom

Square Aspect Ratio - Upcoming competition.

When I googled what makes a good square photograph, this came up first with the AI response. I happen to agree, so I hope it might help you in putting in a square image for the upcoming monthly competition

A good square photograph effectively utilizes the balanced and symmetrical nature of the square format to create a strong composition. This often involves using the center as a focal point, employing lines to guide the viewer's eye, and emphasizing shapes and minimalist subjects. The square format can also be used to create a sense of balance, symmetry, and immersive exploration within the frame.

Here's a breakdown of key elements that contribute to a successful square photograph:

1. Composition:

Central Subject:

The square format naturally draws the eye to the center, making it a great choice for images where the subject is intended to be the primary focus.

Leading Lines:

Lines can effectively guide the viewer's eye around the frame, and diagonal lines can be particularly impactful when they divide the square symmetrically.

Symmetry:

The inherent symmetry of the square can be leveraged to create balanced and visually pleasing compositions.

Minimalism:

The square format can emphasize shapes and forms, making it suitable for minimalist subjects that focus on simplicity and negative space.

Rule of Thirds:

While the center is often emphasized, the rule of thirds (dividing the frame into nine equal parts) can also be useful for placing elements strategically within the square.

2. Subject Matter:

Simple Scenes: The square format can make simple scenes more interesting by emphasizing the shape and form of the subject.

Symmetrical Subjects: Subjects with symmetrical qualities are well-suited to the square format.

Strong Focal Point: It's important to have a clear focal point in a square photograph, as the format doesn't naturally lead the eye in any particular direction.

3. Technical Considerations:

Aspect Ratio:

Ensure your camera or editing software is set to the 1:1 aspect ratio to capture the square format accurately.

Sharpness:

Sharpness is generally important in square format photography, as the format can emphasize detail and form.

Experimentation:

Don't be afraid to experiment with different compositions and subject matter to see what works best within the square format.

4. Thinking Differently:

Beyond the Crop:

It's best to compose with the square in mind from the start rather than cropping a rectangular image to fit, according to a YouTube video by Jeremy Mudd.

Intensified Scale:

The square format can intensify the sense of scale, particularly when using longer lenses.

Competitions 2025/2026

Entry by July for September 2025 - Make It Square

You are required to take or crop your image to display as a square. 1:1 aspect ratio. When it comes to changing aspect ratio, you can do it in two different ways. The first way is through your camera's menu, and the second way is through post-processing software.

Entry by September for November 2025 - Dominant Colour

For your **Colour** entry

Explore the power of a limiting factor of a single dominant colour in your photograph. Whether it's a common colour like black or a rare one like turquoise, showcase your artistic skills by creatively highlighting that colour in your image. This will encourage you to think creatively and develop ideas through colour.

For your Monochrome entry

The dominance of White or Black or other Monochrome colour must be perceived at least 75% overall; above all other shades and tones of grey in a White or Black, or other Monochrome colour. Also consider the general artistic themes outlined in the Colour definition.

Entry by November for January 2026 - This is Australia

Any image that shows a flavour of life in Australia, including landscapes, people, events and places including architecture, birds and animals.

Images may be taken in any of Australia's territories.

Entries must be a single image as captured by the camera. Images must not be 'composite images' that combine subjects or elements from different scenes – replacing a background or sky, for example.

HDR, focus stacking etc that has been performed in camera is permissible.

Entry by Jan 2026 for March 2026 - Insects

Your image is to feature an insect or insects from the Class "Insecta"

This class includes - praying mantids; cockroaches; termites; fleas; dragonflies and damselflies; earwigs; flies; butterflies and moths; grasshoppers, katydids, crickets; beetles; wasps, bees, ants, sawflies.

No crustaceans, spiders, mites, scorpions, millipedes or centipedes.

How you compose or feature the subject is up to you, provided it is alive and free in a natural environment.

Entry by March for May 2026 - Nature - as per 2025

Entry by May for July 2026 - Long Exposure

Any photograph that has been created by a shutter speed longer than, or at, 1/3 of a second.

The aim is to create an image which creates a positive impression and engages the viewer. Any technique may be used provided your selected shutter speed is 1/3 of a second or longer.

Some examples but not limited to are astro, fireworks, light painting, panning, and ICM.

The challenge is finding creative inspiration for your photo.
